



Stoke Reads update

Synectics champions reading

Synectics Solutions in Burslem have been championing Stoke Reads and doing fantastic work to encourage reading among their employees and within the local community. Staff recently took part in Stoke Reads training to support them to read with young people. We are looking to pilot a new reading programme in the autumn, which will see Synectics work with a local secondary school to promote a love of reading.

The Synectics team works tirelessly with the Stoke community and have recently refurbished the Burslem Book Room, with books provided by Stoke-on-Trent Libraries. This volunteer-led library is currently based in the prayer chapel in Swan Bank Methodist church, but will be taking over the entire church keepers' house in 2018.

The Stoke Reads team also presented a module to Synectics staff about the current changes in education that will affect parents and employers. This was a pilot session ahead of some joint events planned with Staffordshire and Stoke Chamber of Commerce.
